- Schools cost money to attend

- Without schooling, orphans and vulnerable children will be on the street, begging, doing manual labor, and vulnerable to victimization
- It is especially difficult for girls to attend school

WHAT DOES ORPHANS AFRICA DO?




Marilynn Primary and Nursery School

The Marilynn schools have been developed into a beautiful campus. We have provided clean water, working restrooms, classrooms, school supplies, a meal program, and health insurance.

This school provides a quality education, and students score high on the national tests. Most of them will graduate and go on to high school.

Marilyn Primary and Nursery School is working towards becoming self-sufficient, which is our long-term goal for all our schools.





Chimbuya Nursery School

The Chimbuya area is an extremely impoverished area. Students can't afford uniforms or other basics. Most children in this area cannot attend school.

We provide school supplies, clean water, daily porridge, and bring shoes, backpacks, toothbrushes and toothpaste and other necessities on our visits.

Our little Chimbuya children meet in a one room classroom with up to 40 students and one teacher. We would like to be able to hire another teacher and find them a better building that also has a outside suitable for playing.

Mbozi Nursery School



Our nursery schools have a quality curriculum which include the ABCs, counting, basic math, basic English, and more.

We provide furniture, school supplies, clean water, daily lunch meal, and an opportunity to sing and play.

Mbozi Nursery School is a model of self-sustainability and can help assist financially with the Chimbuya Nursery School.

Mwaji Secondary School



Mwaji Secondary School is located in the mountains in a small village. This school has grown from a bamboo shack to a thriving school campus.

We've built wells, classrooms, science laboratories, dormitories, teacher housing, a library, and administrative hall.

We provide uniforms, textbooks, school supplies, health insurance, and a meal program.

Children come from all over to be able to attend this school, which has some of the highest test scores in the nation.

Isandula Vocational College



Little by little we have built up a thriving campus on this dry countryside. We have built a well that provides clean water to the school and to the community.

We offer classes in electrical, automotive electrical, solar power, computers, business entrepreneurship, driving, and new this year, a tailoring program. Tanzania needs skilled people in all these areas. We have a near 100% job placement. Education and technical training provides job opportunities and pulls people out of poverty.



HIGHLIGHTS OF 2025



- 400+ students were educated and fed nutritious meals.
- New Girls Dormitory at Isandula Vocational College Opens. The number of female students quadrupled.
- Several orphans graduated from Mwaji Secondary School. Orphans Africa staff were there to represent as their family members during graduation.
- New mattresses and first aid kits with medical supplies arrive.
- New science and chemistry laboratory opens allowing more students to take science classes, especially more girls.
- School supplies, hygiene kits, toothbrushes and toothpaste are delivered.
- New sewing machines are purchased and delivered to Isandula Vocational College.
- New computers are delivered to Mwaji Secondary School.
- Agriculture projects were improved.
